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Business Scope

The TPA Enhancements project is comprised of three phases:

1. PHASE I — ENHANCED PREPAID WIRELESS & LEASECO

(Target for completion: Fourth Quarter, 2000)

Phase I of the *TPA Enhancements* project consists of developing, testing, and implementing two major system enhancements for the existing TPA application. This effort will fulfill defined functional requirements of two AWS development projects currently in progress (*Enhanced Prepaid Wireless* project and phases II & III of the *LeaseCo* project).

Enhanced Prepaid Wireless

The TPA Development Team will develop new functionality for the existing TPA application, which will enable the calculation of taxes for Enhanced Prepaid Wireless products. This development effort will support, and be completed in conjunction with, the development activities of the Enhanced Prepaid Wireless project team.

The primary reference document for this effort is located in Visual SourceSafe under <u>TPA-Project Documentation Library - Tax Related/TPA - Working</u> Reference Documents/Enhanced Prepaid Wireless/EPW BRD 08 23.doc.

LeaseCo — Phases II and III

The TPA Development Team will install new functionality in the existing TPA application to enable the calculation of taxes on lease revenue, including lease life cycle events. This development effort will support, and be completed in conjunction with, the development activities of the LeaseCo - Phase II and Phase III project team.

The primary reference document for this effort is located in Visual SourceSafe under <u>TPA-Project Documentation Library - Tax Related/TPA - Working</u> Reference Documents/ LEASECO/ AWS LeaseCo Phase II BRD.doc.

2. PHASE II — MIGRATION TO TERMINAL SERVER

(Target for completion: First Quarter, 2001)

Phase II of the TPA Enhancements project is intended to enhance the efficiency and performance of the existing TPA application. This will be accomplished by:

Consolidation of TPA databases

The separate MS Access databases of the existing application will be combined into a single SQL database.



Implementing new functionality

The new functionality, which was developed during Phase I, will be incorporated into the newly combined TPA application.

TPA Migration to Terminal Server

The combined and enhanced TPA application will be migrated from its original NT workstation environment to a terminal server.

Implementing High-Priority User-Defined Enhancements

The TPA Development Team will develop, test, and implement "high-priority", user-defined enhancements as described in PHASE II REQUIREMENTS on page 6.

3. PHASE III — TPA ENHANCEMENT

(Target for completion: To be determined during Phase II)

Phase III of the TPA Enhancements project is intended to provide additional functionality, efficiency, and performance, which will be defined during Phase II. This effort consists of the following items.

Implementing Low-Priority User-Defined Enhancements

The TPA Development Team will develop, test, and implement "low-priority", user-defined enhancements as described in PHASE III REQUIREMENTS on page 51.

Evaluation of Tax Compliance Software Packages

The TPA Development Team will research and evaluate tax-compliance software packages, which are available through third-party vendors. The purpose of this evaluation is to provide software that will eventually augment or replace the current Tax Process Automation system.

Business Needs (Goals and Objectives)

As the result of discussions and analyses performed in cooperation with the Customer, AWS Tax Department, the following business needs have been defined.


- Create a single TPA Database accessible to all tax compliance personnel, nationwide.
- Provide the increased flexibility to:
 - process by billing cycle.
 - post payments to Oracle according to when they should be paid.



- 3. Create process efficiencies by:
 - > replacing manual procedures with automated ones, as appropriate.
 - eliminating or reducing errors during processing.
 - > eliminating the need for two separate processing periods during the month.
 - eliminating unnecessary reports.
- 4. Provide new functionality to support the calculation of taxes for:
 - Enhanced Prepaid Wireless products.
 - AWS Lease Revenue.
 - AWS Lease Life Cycle events.
- 5. Implement user-defined system enhancements, which are designed to improve:
 - reliability of the TPA application.
 - accuracy of the TPA application.
 - accessibility of the TPA application.
 - efficiency of the TPA application

Document Conventions

Development Sequence

While each requirement is presented in this document in numerical order, the sequence of the development effort will be in a different order. The developer and the Customer have agreed to the order of development production as listed in Appendix E.

PHASE I REQUIREMENTS

Enhanced Prepaid Wireless

1. TPA-PHASE 1 – 4.0

The Customer needs the ability to schedule the Oracle data pull down process automatically or manually.

1. BUSINESS NEEDS

- Oracle data must be pulled in a reasonable timeframe.
- > The start of the Oracle data pull down process may be invoked either manually or by automatic scheduling.
- This process should be available on any day of the month.
- One of the major goals of this requirement is to minimize time out errors, including API errors.
- > Although not a requirement, the customer would like to have the three (3) existing Oracle pull down processes combined if efficiencies can be found.

2. **CURRENT PROCESS**

The user must manually start this process for each engine. It may take up to four (4) hours to download the data from Oracle. During the process, the system often reports timeout and API errors, which slow down the process. The following three (3) engines pull data down from Oracle.

ODPD Engine: Pulls the general ledger data. This data is used to create account

analysis reports. Also, the data is used in other engines.

Pulls the accounts payable data and then calculates the use tax **CUDL Engine:**

on the Oracle Accounts Payable invoices that are flagged by

Accounts Payable as use tax.

FASA Engine: Pulls fixed assets that are marked for sale and calculates the

taxes related to the resale of the lease assets.

2. TPA-PHASE 1 – 5.0

Business Requirement Note: Requirement Number TPA-PHASE 1 – 8.0 was merged into this requirement (TPA-PHASE 1 – 5.0).

The Customer requires that inaccurate reporting be reduced. Also, reduce the manual research process that results from the method used to derive the State data element for various reports.

1. **BUSINESS NEEDS**

The following, related action items have been defined by the Customer:

- ➤ Eliminate the State data element from the following reports:
 - AASR Missing Companies in COSO to Company Report
 - AASR Account Analysis by G/L Account
 - AASR Account Analysis by Company
 - AASR Account Analysis by Company/Office
 - AASR Standard Entries by Description
 - AASR Standard Entries by Company/Office
 - RECO Reconciliation of Titan TPA vs. Oracle
 - EBAL and FEDE reports
 - SALE Tax Data not Sent to TaxPac
 - SALE Tax Data vs. Ending Balance All Accounts

The remaining data and sort criteria should remain the same.

- Reduce inaccurate reporting.
- Reduce the manual process needed to research the inaccuracies reported. Consensus is that the state determination is currently by company. A problem exists because the activities for each company contain multiple state activity.
- Remove the AASR exception table/functionality.
- Consolidate tables where appropriate (ODPD, AASR, G/L balances current period, etc) to ensure data integrity.

Consolidation of these tables should not result in the loss of existing functionality. If the consolidation can be done, the following reports will longer be needed:

- ODPD Ending Balance by G/L Coding
- ODPD Category Pull Down by Company

2. CURRENT PROCESS

TPA generates the reports discussed in the Business Needs section above. Currently, these reports are sorted primarily by state, which causes inaccurate reporting and a manual research process. The AASR exception table is used to exclude certain G/L account activity from the reports by state.

3. SOLUTION

This is an on-going effort as a result of the process of preparing for the conversion to the sequel server environment.

3. TPA-PHASE 1 - 6.0

Customer wants to eliminate the manual review process that is needed to determine if the company number in the CUDL engine is not contained in the COSORN to Company table.

PHASE III NOTE: This represents a major productivity enhancement. If time permits,

this development effort should be included ion Phase II.

If time does not permit, this additional functionality will be scheduled in Phase III.

BUSINESS NEEDS

The Customer needs the following:

- > A missing row validation in the CUTX engine is needed if the Company Number in the CUDL engine for a particular State and Tax Type is not contained in the COSORN to the Company table for the State and Tax Type.
- > The ability to view on an error log.
- > To eliminate of the manual review.
- > To minimize the time spent comparing CUTX and CUDL reports.

CURRENT PROCESS 2.

The Customer manually views the report to determine the error, which results in the CUDL and CUTX reports not balancing.

4. TPA-PHASE 1 - 7.0

The Customer needs to limit the reports to only those that are needed. Superfluous reports should be eliminated.

1. Business Needs

Provide only the appropriate reports that are currently required.

2. CURRENT PROCESS

Currently many reports are generated whether they are needed or not. A complete list of current reports are located in Appendix C.

3. SOLUTION

In order to streamline the reporting function, the reports generated via TPA should be limited to those currently needed by the Customer. The current reports that are to be **eliminated** are:

- ➤ RECO CBIS vs. Thesys by Tran Code & Cycle
- > RECO CBIS vs. Thesys by State/Tax Name and Sale Tax Dollars to Zero Percentage County.

5. TPA-PHASE 1 – 9.0

Eliminate the need to manually manipulate amounts in reports that are required to troubleshoot data issues regarding the CUTX engine.

1. BUSINESS NEEDS

- A new report in the CUTX engine is needed. The title should be "CUTX Titan" Use Tax Sum by G/L".
- The report should list state, company, office, G/L account, and amount with a sum by the following:
 - By G/L account
 - By State
 - BY total of State and G/L account
- > The amounts should tied to the CUTX report by EIN. In other words, the report should reflect the tax amounts computed on the TITAN inventory giveaways.
- State should be based on geocode.

2. Current Process

In the case of T Code breakout, all geocodes must be entered in the Vendor table. This requires the same vendor to be entered hundreds of times.

3. SOLUTION

6. TPA-PHASE 1 - 10.0

Business Requirement Note: Requirement Number TPA-PHASE 1 – 28.0 was merged into this requirement (TPA-PHASE 1 – 10.0).

Eliminate the need to prepare manual spreadsheets of tax data by State and Tax form.

1. Business Needs

- > A new report (in CTPF) is needed to reflect the amounts sent to TaxPac by tax form net of vendor's comp included in ATT Works.
- Report can be generated before or after vendor's compensation is extracted.
- > Report should include State, Tax Form, EIN, Company Name, Tax Type and Amount.
- Report should be sorted first by State and second by tax form.
- Report should be summed first by EIN, then tax form, then state and finally grand total.

CURRENT PROCESS

Users currently prepare manual spreadsheets of tax data by State and Tax form.

- Query the report on criteria that the customer specifies.

8. TPA-PHASE 1 - 15.0

Business Requirement Note: Requirement Number TPA-PHASE 1 – 25.0 was merged into this requirement (TPA-PHASE 1 – 15.0).

Functionality is needed to support reporting by outlets (retail stores).

1. Business Needs

- > Some returns require data to be reported by outlet or retail location. The Customer needs the ability to accommodate reporting by outlets.
- > The current CTPF file provides a field for division which could be used to transmit the outlet information to TaxPac
- > A table is needed by State, Engine and Tax Type to designate the outlet location number. The fields would include geocode (wildcard preferred or all functionality), office number and division
- The CTPF engine should be modified to consider reporting by division number utilizing this new table (CTPF currently uses the COSORN to County table for division number in Florida which would continue to be needed.

CURRENT PROCESS

The TPA or TaxPac does not currently support outlet reporting. TaxPac will support outlet stores in the future based on location numbers.

3. SOLUTION

SALE and BDBT Engines (Wisdem Only)

These engines should allow the processing of Wisdem by cycle (same as today.) Wisdem must be able to support files by cycles.

9. TPA-PHASE 1 – 16.0

The Customer needs the ability to process throughout the month, which includes TaxPac and Oracle.

1. Business Needs

- > Streamline the FEDE engine by creating a database that combines the current "10th-of-the-month" database and the "20th-of-the-month" databasen.
- > The Customer needs the ability to process selected data on any day of the month.
- > Each CTPF and COOF file that is processed must have a different file name.
- > The CTPF and COOF engines should have the ability to be processed by all States or selected States and Form IDs.
- Processed data should remain in the Sale Data table until the month is closed.

CURRENT PROCESS

Tax returns are due to be received by some municipalities at various times during the month. Complete processing of all data can not be accomplished by the initial due date of some returns. A special FEDE engine is used to create a COOF file due on the 10th-of-the-month.

A separate 10th-of-the-month database (separate instance of TPA) is used to process other tax data that is due before all tax data is completely processed by the 20th-of-the-month database.

3. SOLUTION

From within the CTPF and COOF engines, the Customer will select all of the States, or a specific State(s) Form-ID to define the data to be processed on a given day.

In order to permit the CTPF and COOF engines to facilitate the view or selection of States and Form IDs, an engine is needed prior to CTPF to append Form IDs to all records in the Tax Data table.

10. TPA-PHASE 1 - 17.0

The Customer needs the ability to exclude quarterly payments from the monthly upload to Oracle. Quarterly payments should to be uploaded to Oracle for payment when the payments are due.

1. BUSINESS NEEDS

- > Still include the calculation of the payments in the monthly process.
- ➤ Hold any monthly payments associated with quarterly payments in TPA until which time they are due.
- Upload the quarterly payments to Oracle when they are due.
- Designate a tax form as a quarterly return. This could be entered in global table by Tax Type, State, etc.

2. CURRENT PROCESS

The quarterly payments are computed during the normal monthly processing and are calculated on a monthly basis. The A/P Otis file is sent to Oracle and a check is cut for all payments including the quarterly payments. These checks are then sent back to the Tax Accountant. The Tax Accountant holds onto these checks until the quarterly payments are due, then are forwarded to the appropriate municipality.

There are several problems with this current process. First, the Tax Accountant must hold the physical monthly checks in a desk drawer. Second, a total of three (3) checks may be sent for one quarterly payment.

3. SOLUTION

AUTHOR'S NOTE

The following text is the Customer's current understanding as to how this can be accomplished. It needs to be reviewed by the developer for accuracy and completeness, and understanding.

Requirement to Handle Quarterly Payments, etc.

- A table is needed to enter the due dates for returns not due on a monthly basis (in essence-the exceptions.) The table should be pulled down by Form ID steered from the Vendor table. Users should populate the months (Jan, Feb Mar, etc.) for which such return will not be processed.
- 2. When COOF creates the output file for selected States and tax types, if the month for the form ID in the exception table matches the processing month, it will be kept in the Sale Data table. (Consider moving to a separate SALE history table if it distorts the SALE reports.)
- 3. Records should be flagged as processed when the COOF file is run.



4. Close the Period: When closing the period, all records processed should be deleted as well as any GLTX records that have not been processed as these will be processed again with the next month's GLTX engine. (Consider how the RIMS local breakout works on GLTX.)

Requirement to Process Records Intermittently

- 1. SALE and BDBT engines (Wisdem Only): These engines should allow the processing of Wisdem by cycle (same as today.) Wisdem must be able to support files by cycles.
- 2. COOF: This engine should allow an FTP file to be created for State (All or selected ones) and Tax Type (All or selected ones)

11. TPA-PHASE 1 - 18.0

Eliminate the manual process needed to correct the errors that are caused when an A/P Otis upload is sent before a previous A/P Otis upload is imported.

1. Business Needs

- > Reduce the errors received by trying to upload multiple files at one time.
- Prevent the upload of a separate file prior to the previous file being imported, if possible.
- Eliminate the manual process needed to correct errors.
- > Or ability to monitor the A/P Otis uploads into Oracle, which will allow the customer to view if the file has been uploaded. This will allow them to know when it is okay to send another file.

CURRENT PROCESS

If a file is importing and another file is sent then it appends to the files and causes and error. This creates a manual process the customer must do to correct...

12. TPA-PHASE 1 - 19.0

Business Requirement Note: Requirement Number TPA-PHASE 1 – 20.0 was merged into this requirement (TPA-PHASE 1 – 19.0).

Create separate invoice number for records with the same Vendor Number but different Vendor Sites, and for each legal entity and Form ID.

1. **BUSINESS NEEDS**

Create separate invoice numbers for records with the same Vendor Number but different Vendor sites.

A/P needs the ability to match tax transactions in Oracle with payments made by Cash Management via ACH Wire logs. This facilitates the generation of separate checks by legal entities for pay alone vendors

This will reduce the need to manually change invoice numbers.

2. **CURRENT PROCESS**

Invoice numbers are created for each COOF upload. Vendor numbers can contain a number of vendor sites. This creates a problem because Oracle will not accept the same invoice number for vendor numbers with different vendor sites.

Users currently manually change the invoice number in the COOF file to generate separate checks or are not meeting A/P needs.



Appendix B -**Terms and Definitions**

Acronym / Term	Definition
TPA	Tax Process Automation System – automatically generates AWS monthly filings from tax dollars that are imported into the TPA system in the form of data files, from data retrieved from Oracle financial systems and from calculations performed by the TPA system. The TPA system also creates a file that is uploaded to A/P to generate tax payments and record entries into the Oracle financial systems.

CUDL Engine	Custom Use Tax Oracle Download Engine – pulls data for invoices flagged for use tax in Oracle. It creates a table and unstacks the Oracle tax based upon tax types and rates contained in the Custom Use Tax Mapping table. Also, appends new Oracle tax names to the mapping tables.
CUDL Table	Customer Use Tax Download Table – contains data pulled from Oracle for items which have been flagged in Oracle for use tax
EBAL	Ending Balance – compares tax amounts in the Tax Data table to Oracle balances pulled by ODPD entry and appends these differences to the Tax Data table.
ODPD	Oracle Data Pulldown – retrieves Oracle categories listed in the Tax Type Mapping and Otis Category tables as well as G/L balances for accounts listed in the Tax Type Mapping table with a form Name of Oracle Mapping or none
PRPD	Prepaid Calling Card – calculates the tax amount on prepaid calling card usage activity imported into the TPA system and filtered by the Prepaid Carrier Code table
RECO	Reconciliation – automatically reconciles Thesys tax data files imported into TPA with CBIS revenue data files imported into MARR's utilizing the Tran Code Filter table. Also reconciles the Titan tax datafile with amounts booked to Oracle.
RHOM	Rerate to Home – utilizes the MARR's system RTH Minutes and Reclass tables and calculates the reversal of taxes on calls which were rerated to home rates to avoid double taxation.
SALE	Sale Tax – accumulates applicable information in the Tax Data table utilizing information contained in imported data files, data pulled from Oracle, as well as Tax Type Mapping, Thesys, Titan, and Oracle Mapping and other global table information.
CTPF	Create TaxPac File – creates a file to TaxPac software utilizing the Tax Data table
COOF	Create Oracle Otis File – creates the Otis file to send to Oracle A/P utilizing the Tax Data table.
CUTX	Custom Use Tax – gathers Oracle use tax data by utilizing CUDL data retrieved from Oracle and the Customer Use Tax Mapping table and places it in the Tax Data table. Also, calculates use tax on free or discounted equipment by applying tax rates in the respective mapping tables to data entered in the Titan datafile.
Thesys (WISDEM) data file	Breaks down the taxes recorded in the CBIS revenue entry by Tax Code. Generated on a cyclic basis at the time the cycle information is loaded into Wisdem to capture accurate tax code information, as tax code history is maintained in WISDEM.
Prepaid Data file	Reflects the prepaid calling card activity for all wireless customers for the processing month
Geocode	Identifies the location in which the tax detail transaction was conducted. It is used to uniquely identify every locality in the US. Each geocode is associated with a set of tax rates. Is a nine-position numeric code maintained by Vertex. It uses 2 digits for state, 3 digits for county and 4 digits for city. Primary reason to use geocodes is to convert tax codes to taxing jurisdictions recognizable by the TaxPac software for the purposes of generating tax forms.
